Phil Heimlich is a renowned public speaker, political commentator and recent Congressional candidate, and starting May 3, 2008, host of the nationally syndicated radio show, *Hard Truths with Phil Heimlich*.

Phil believes that "We will only find the answers to the difficult issues facing our country when we stop looking in the wrong places. We will not find answers in the often empty debate between Democrats and Republicans, nor with those labeled 'liberals' or 'conservatives.' Hard Truths seeks the difficult answers where they can best be found- in the pages of history, through our own common sense, and most importantly in the Word of God."

Phil graduated with Distinction from Stanford University in 1975 and received his law degree from the University of Virginia Law School in 1979. Phil served as an Assistant County Prosecutor in Cincinnati, Ohio, where he specialized in the prosecution of felony cases, including murder, rape, robbery, assault and white-collar offenses.

Phil was elected to Cincinnati City Council in 1993 on a platform of adding more police. He fulfilled that pledge and became known as the one city leader who would support the police even when it was unpopular, most notably during the riots of 2001. He implemented a teen curfew, privatized government services, and passed laws restricting strip clubs and porn shops. These accomplishments led to his being reelected three consecutive times.

Phil was voted in as Hamilton County (Ohio) Commissioner in 2002. He immediately got out-of-control spending under the rate of inflation and kept it there each year he was in office. He cut taxes by \$100 million over five years,

and exposed massive waste at a taxpayer-funded hospital – waste that was jeopardizing care and threatening to bankrupt the facility. He saved the hospital, improved its management and eliminated further need for taxpayer support.

Phil has a passion for school choice. This led him to start two charter schools: Riverside Academy, an elementary school, and the Life Skills Center, which provides academic instruction, job training, and job placement for high school dropouts. He was the founding co-chair of the Children's Scholarship Fund that has raised \$3.5 million in scholarships for low-income children to attend private schools.

Phil is married to Rebecca Heimlich, a former Clermont County Assistant Prosecutor and they are parents of two children, Henry, age 4, and Allie, age 2.
